

✓ ceramics


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
Conservation and Restoration of Ceramics and Glass Department

✓ glass


During the six years of education, our students accuires abilities in cleaning, bonding and filling losses of glass, ceramics and stained glass artefacts, according to actual ICOMOS and Corpus Vitrearum Medii Aevi guidelines. Students are professionally prepared to work with authentic materials by specialized scientific staff - practising art conservators from each of the described areas.




















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From the very beggining, each stage of conservation is preceded by analysis and discussion about the best solutions. Every object is treated individually.



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We use various conservation materials, selected individually for each object, taking into account its character, condition and natural environment.






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Preponderant element of education at Conservation and Restoration of Ceramics and Glass in our Academy is programme of apprenticeship training, during which students undertake professional conservation of artefact in its natural habitat.





The practical skills of our staff and students are confirmed by cooperation with museums and numerous conservation works realized in many historical monuments, such as inter alia:

Conservation of stained glass:

Cathedral Church in Poznań, Sanctuary of Saint Joseph in Kalisz, St. Anthony's Church in Piła, City Church in Wejherowo, palace building in Kerpen- Deutchland, Museum of Architecture in Wrocław.

✓ Conservation of glass:

XIXth century mirror from the National Museum in Wrocław, enameled rennaissance glass from Museum in Nysa, archaeological glass vessels from Ostrów Tumski in Wrocław.


✓ Conservation of ceramics:

Stove tiles from Luboradz Palace, Fourmaintraux Freres faience vase from Nysa Museum, porcelain vase decorated with lacquer, ceramic architectural floral element from the facade of Renoma Merchant Home, archaeological Lusatian vase from excavations in Legnica.








 Our students need to learn basic craft skills as cutting glass, painting and assembling into lead canes, what is indispensible in conservator work too.

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









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


